

From Rabbi Krauss

On the top of current Jewish concerns lie Israel and antisemitism. Modern political Zionism and Israel were designed to combat antisemitism, however, much of recent overt expressions of antisemitism call for "Free Palestine and open anti-Israel words." Of



course, antisemitism is millennia older than the modern State of Israel. Our prayers are for a true and lasting peace for Israel. Hamas rule can be replaced, as proposed by Egypt, Turkey and Qatar.

Prior to the horrific October 7th, Qatar supplied large sums of money to Gaza, presumably for humanitarian purposes. Hamas used much of the money to build tunnels and to smuggle arms. Sadly, this was actually encouraged by Israel's government. The motivation to keep Hamas in power allowing disunity in Palestinian rule to prevent the rise of a State of Palestine.

The prolonged war in Gaza has led to Israel's isolation. This was dramatically shown when Netanyahu spoke to a largely empty UN hall. No other speaker has had that experience.

With G-ds help Israel, in the end, can be a "Light unto the Nations" as the prophet Isaiah proclaimed.




MISSION STATEMENT




